



# NORTH OF PORTUGAL



Portugal was born in the North. It was in the Porto and North regions that the Portuguese began as a people and nation. Here we learn the value of difference, but also the complementarity of cultures.

Oporto, a World Heritage city, is the great gateway and can be the starting point for a trip for the region's natural and cultural diversity. It is known for the wine that goes from here to around the world, but also by the School of Architecture, where the names of Álvaro Siza Vieira and Souto de Moura, both Pritzker Prizes, came out. And also for a heritage that knows how to combine the antiquity of churches and monuments, such as the Cathedral or the Church of S. Francisco, with the contemporaneity of striking buildings such as the Casa da Música (House of Music), the Serralves Museum and others.

The Douro river crosses the region. It enters Portugal tight between ravines and mountains of the interior to cross the whole landscape of the World Heritage where the wines of Porto and the Douro are cultivated. There you cross the wine that follows to the Caves of Gaia and the cruises that visit the region.

In this region of mountains and natural parks, the patrimony is spread by castles, such as Guimarães, or by sanctuaries and churches that in summer are the stage of pilgrimages. Next to rural hermitages we find the baroque of the North of Portugal made of granite and gilded carving. In cities that knew how to preserve the human scale, such as Viana do Castelo, Braga, Lamego, Chaves or Vila Real, or in manors and manors, we find the most authentic Portuguese, the one who genuinely likes to receive, to share his table and traditions. In Oporto and North of Portugal one lives in a natural way the joy and gratitude for all that we have and are.



# **CENTER OF PORTUGAL**



At last, the highlight: Fatima, where we find the Sanctuary of Fatima, a place of Catholic pilgrimage and annually

Some of these places are so important for humanity that they have been included in the UNESCO list of world heritage. This is the case of the Monasteries of Alcobaca and Batalha, the Convent of Christ in Tomar and Coimbra University.

But there are other unique features that are well worth discovering. For example, the historic villages and castles that defended the nation's borders. The Schist Villages and the towns of whitewashed houses, like Óbidos, a treasure within walls. The cities, where modernity is combined with tradition - Coimbra, the university city, Aveiro between the Ria and the sea, and Viseu, Guarda and Castelo Branco, in which the stone architecture retains traces of an immemorial past.

Serra da Estrela, the highest peak in mainland Portugal, is the star of the mountains, with its endless landscapes and glacial lagoons. But there are also the Lousã, Acor and Caramulo ranges, where you can discover nature by hiking or by bike. Here you can also try rock climbing, abseiling, rafting or canoeing, for example in the Naturtejo Geopark, a preserved area where several species of birds and animals live.

The crystal clear waters that rise from the thermal springs balance the body and soul. And the beaches! River beaches surrounded by forests and coastal beaches open to the Atlantic ocean, provide certain freshness on hot summer days. They are also well known spots for surfers from around the world, who come for the perfect waves in Peniche, and even the giant waves in Nazaré.



There are flavours for every palate to comfort the stomach: cheese and sausages, bouillabaisses and roast suckling pig, honey and convent sweets; and for raising the spirits, you can rely on the excellent wines from the demarcated regions. They are all the product of the know-how of the people, who are genuinely welcoming in receiving their visitors with the best they have to offer.



# REGION OF LISBON OSTRIS OSTR


Lisbon is Portugal's capital and the hub of a multifaceted area that appeals to different tastes and senses


In a city that has been influenced by many different far-off cultures over time, there is still a village feel in each historic neighbourhood. Stroll through the Pombaline grid of streets in the Baixa district that opens on to the Tagus in Praça do Comércio, then follow the river to discover some of the city's most beautiful parts: the monumental area of Belém with its World Heritage monuments, the mediaeval quarters and the latest contemporary leisure spaces, such as the Parque das Nações.

If you continue to the mouth of the river, you'll understand why we say that Lisbon is the centre of a vast resort. Along the coastal road you'll find beaches and beach resorts that combine villas and hotels from the beginning of the 20th century with marinas, terraces and excellent golf courses. Further along the coast you'll come across world-renowned surfing beaches, but also the palaces scattered across the cultural landscape of Sintra, a World Heritage Site.

The wide variety of landscapes and heritage is always close by, whether to the north or south of the capital. With beaches, natural parks, cultural routes and accommodation for all tastes, it is hard to escape the Lisbon region on a visit to Portugal.

Fado is another expression of what it is to be Portuguese that has also been awarded World Heritage status. You can hear it at night in a fado house or in a traditional neighbourhood. But go, as well, to the lively bars and nightclubs, to find other types of music. From reggae to African music, new wave, indie or electronic, there's a great diversity of sounds and environments, but all are good excuses to have a drink and dance the night away.





The plains that extend as far as the eye can see the heat and a slower pace of life. This is the

To the north, the pastures of the marshlands; in the vast interior, unending flatness, and fields of wheat waving in the wind; at the coast, wild, beautiful beaches waiting to be discovered.

The vastness of the landscape is dotted with cork oaks and olive trees that withstand time. Santarém is a natural viewpoint over the immensity of the Tagus. Here and there, you find a walled town, such as Marvão or Monsaraz, or an ancient dolmen to recall the magic of the place. Around the hills, low, whitewashed houses stand on small knolls, castles evoke battles and conquests and the yards and gardens are witness to the Arab influences which shaped the people and nature.

In the Alentejo the power of the land marks the time and cities like Elvas and Évora, listed as World Heritage by UNESCO, show the tenacity of the people. Perhaps this is the reason that culture and spirituality take on a singular character here. These memories of the past are also shared by other cities, such as Santarém, Portalegre and Beja, and in the former Jewish quarters, particularly in Castelo de Vide.

The flat land makes hiking and cycling easy, though horses are also part of the landscape.



You can combine these rides with birdwatching and, in dams such as Alqueva, with the tranquillity of the waters or stargazing.

But you must also explore the coast. The landscape here is hilly and rugged, with small sheltered coves between the cliffs, many of which are ideal for surfing.

You will also breathe the scents of the countryside here, the aromatic herbs that season the fish, seafood and other regional fare to be accompanied by the region's excellent wines. Indeed, the entire Alentejo lives according to the rhythm of the earth.



# **REGION OF ALGARVE**




It was here that, in the 15th century, the Portuguese set off on the epic journey that led them to discover other peoples and cultures... and it is in the Algarve that we cheerfully welcome many of our visitors. Even the climate is mild and sunny all year round!

There's no shortage of high quality beaches either. Sandy stretches as far as the eye can see, framed by golden cliffs, virtually deserted islands marking the boundary between Ria Formosa and the sea, and small coves sheltered by the rocks. The ocean, in every shade of blue and mostly calm and warm, invites you for long swims and to indulge in water sports.

And there are also the mountains, where people live in harmony with nature and maintain traditions that they love to share. And the cities. Silves preserves traces of its Arab past and Lagos from the time of the Discoveries. More cosmopolitan Portimão and Albufeira are bustling towns by night and day. Tavira is a showcase for traditional architecture and Faro, the gateway to the region, deserves a long stop to discover its beautiful historic centre.

To relax, you can have various treatments in the spas and thalassotherapy centres and in the Monchique Thermal Baths. There are also many internationally acclaimed golf courses where you can enjoy a spot of exercise. And hotels, tourist villages, resorts, from the simplest to the most sophisticated. In short, a varied array sharing a genuine love for hospitality.

You can use footpaths and cycle trails to get to know the region, such as the Algarve Way inland or the Vicentine Route along one of the best preserved coastal stretches. And boat rides are another ecological way to observe the flora and fauna.



At the table, you will be delighted with the fresh fish and seafood, either grilled or in a casserole. These are divine flavours which you can enjoy on a simple beach terrace or in the most refined Michelin-starred restaurants, where chefs turn out new versions of traditional cuisine. They are further experiences not to be missed on a visit to the region.



Right in the middle of the Atlantic, the islands of Madeira and Porto Santo are a haven of natural beauty. The exotic colours of the flowers stand out from among the blue sea and the emerald green vegetation; this is an archipelago where two thirds are a protected area and where the largest Laurisilya forest in the world is located.

The springtime temperature, felt all year round, cries out for open air activities. You can go for a walk along the network of levadas (irrigation channels), visit the city of Funchal and discover the heritage associated with the Discoveries or roam freely around the island. Boat rides are an excellent way of admiring the coastline from a different perspective.

In such a naturally welcoming environment, balance and well-being are taken for granted. Madeira offers various tourist complexes and accesses to the sea with prime conditions for leisure boating and scuba diving. The island of Porto Santo, in particular, is the ideal place to escape from stress and undertake a thalassotherapy programme, or a beach holiday combined with a spot of golf.

Popular feasts, which take place all year round, are opportunities to appreciate traditional gastronomic flavours and see Madeira partying, especially for the Carnival parades, the Flower Festival, the Atlantic Festival and, above all, the end-of-year fireworks display.







Mother Nature has created a land full of natural beauty, ready to be explored in the blue immensity of the Atlantic Ocean; the Azores

To the East, on the island of Santa Maria, the beaches of warm white sand are inviting, and the vineyards covering the slopes like an amphitheatre resemble giant staircases. São Miguel, the largest island, is seductive with its Sete Cidades and Fogo Lagoons. The power that emanates from the earth is felt in the geysers, hot thermal waters and volcanic lakes, as well as in the tasty "Cozido das Furnas" slowly cooked inside the earth


In the Central Group, the islands of Terceira, São Jorge, Pico, Faial and Graciosa are set harmoniously in the deep blue sea, where whales and dolphins can be spotted, to the delight of visitors. On Terceira, the World Heritage town of Angra do Heroísmo, as well as its festivals, is steeped in history. Faial is the cool blue of the hydrangeas, the marina painted colourfully by yachtsmen from all over the world and the extinct Capelinhos volcano, which resembles a lunar landscape. In front is Pico, a mountain that emerges from the sea, with vineyards planted in black lava fields, a unique culture that also has World Heritage status. On São Jorge, the highlights are the Fajãs and the cheese, a unique specialty with an unmistakable flavour. Graciosa, graceful in both name and appearance, is an island of green fields covered with vineyards that contrast with its peculiar windmills.


In the Western group, on the island of Flores, the beauty of the natural waterfalls and lakes carved out by volcanoes is dazzling. The tiny island of Corvo has a broad, beautiful crater at its centre, and attracts many species of birds coming from both Europe and America.

These are the Azores. Nine islands, nine small worlds that have as many similarities as differences, but where the friendliness of their inhabitants is shared by all.

Return to the hotel.



### DAY 3. PORTO | VALE DO DOURO | PORTO





Then we follow to Braga, one of the oldest Christian cities in the world with a vast religious heritage like the sanctuaries that make up the triangle of faith: the Cathedral and the Sanctuaries of Bom Jesus and Sameiro. After leaving Braga we head to Guimarães, considered as the cradle of Portugal since Alphonse Henriques who will become the first king was born there. Considered the birth place of Portugal, the historic center of Guimarães located within the walls has been declared World Heritage by UNESCO, based on the values of originality and authenticity that have guided its renovation. Return to Porto.

Overnight in Porto.

### DAY 1. PORTO

Arrival at Porto airport and pick-up of the rental car. Rest of the day free.

### DAY 2. PORTO

Breakfast at the hotel. With a magnificent location near the mouth of the Douro and an architectonic ensemble of exceptional value, the historic center of Porto is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We will visit the 12th century Cathedral (visit\* to the cloisters is not included), the Church of São Francisco (whose interior is covered with gold) is one of the most remarkable examples of Portuguese Baroque. Also discover other important places, such as the Lello Bookstore, the Majestic Café and the magnificent São Bento Station. Free time for lunch. We then continue heading for the Serralves Park which extends from



### DAY 4. PORTO | COIMBRA | FÁTIMA | LISBON

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. We descend to Coimbra, the city of students, so called to host one of the first universities in Europe and the largest in the country. Stroll in the oldest part of Coimbra, made of narrow and steep streets that lead to the top of the hill. Later we continue to Fátima, place of faith and a pilgrimage world center.

Overnight in Lisbon.

### DAY 5. LISBON

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure to the district of Castelo on a convenient TukTuk ride towards the Castle of São Jorge, located on the highest hill of Lisbon, one of the most emblematic monuments of the capital. Then we will descend the old district of Alfama, known by its white houses, labyrinthine streets, inner courtyards and dead ends. Free time for lunch. We leave for Belém, where monuments referring to the Maritime Discovery era in the 15th and 16th centuries were built, such as the Belém Tower, the Monument to the Discoveries and the Jerónimos Monastery. Visit to the National Coach Museum, containing one of the most important and rich collections of coaches in the world. Return to the hotel.

Overnight in Lisbon.

### DAY 6. LISBON | SINTRA | CASCAIS | ESTORIL | LISBON

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure towards Sintra, a magnificent UNESCO World Heritage site. Discover the charms and history of the town that enchanted kings and poets. Visit to the romantic Pena Palace or Sintra's Royal Palace ( Subject to availability). If the weather allows, we will stop at the western point of mainland Europe, Cabo da Roca. On the way to Cascais along the coast, be dazzled by the seascape. In Estoril, place where Ian Fleming got the idea for the James Bond movies, we highlight the gardens of the Casino. Return to the hotel.

### DAY 8. LISBON | ÉVORA | ESTREMOZ | LISBON

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure to Évora, a World Heritage Site: bright, surrounded by ramparts, it houses a superb monumental complex including the Roman Temple of Diana, the imposing Cathedral, the Church of São Francisco and its mysterious Chapel of Bones. Visit to a wine estate with wine tasting. Departure to Estremoz, knowned as "the white city" due to its block of houses of this color, but also to be one of the largest exporters of white marble in the world. Return to Lisbon.

Overnight in Lisbon.

### DAY 9. LISBON

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Rental car drop off at Lisbon airport.

### DAY 3. QUELUZ | ÉVORA | ESTREMOZ | CASTELO DE VIDE | MARVÃO

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Drive to Évora, standing in the middle of the beautiful plains of the Alentejo. This walled city was declared World Heritage by UNESCO. We highlight the Roman Temple and the curious Chapel of Bones. In the afternoon, visit Estremoz, a town dominated by its Medieval Castle. Then, Castelo de Vide and its winding streets with old white houses.

Overnight in Marvão.

### DAY 4. MARVÃO | TOMAR | COIMBRA | VISEU

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Trip to Tomar, city of the Templar Knights, with its Convent of Christ, a city ex-libris. Continue to Coimbra, the city of students, so called to host one of the first universities in Europe and the most important of the country. Stroll in the oldest part of Coimbra, made of narrow streets that lead to the top of the hill. Departure to Viseu, an ancient city, built of grey stone but at the same time green, lively and welcoming, Overnight in Viseu.

### DAY 1. LISBON | QUELUZ

Arrival at Lisbon airport and pick-up of the rental car. Drive to Queluz.

Overnight in Queluz.

# DAY 2. QUELUZ | SINTRA | ESTORIL | QUELUZ

Breakfast at the hotel. Set off to the magnificent UNESCO World Heritage town of Sintra. Discover its charms and history, exploring the historic center, and taste the local sweet delicacies: travesseiros and queijadas. Then, drive to the westernmost point of mainland Europe, Cabo da Roca. On the way to Cascais along the coast, appreciate the seascape. In Estoril, place where Ian Fleming got the idea for the James Bond movies, we highlight the gardens of the Casino.

Overnight in Queluz.



### DAY 5. VISEU | LAMEGO | PESO DA RÉGUA | AMARANTE | **AMARES**

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Departure to Lamego, an episcopal city known by the Baroque Sanctuary of Nossa Senhora dos Milagres. To the north, located on the banks of the Douro River, Peso da Régua played an important role in the production and marketing of Port Wine, since it was from this village that the wine barrels were transported by special boats equipped with a long rudder to Vila Nova de Gaia, where the wine was aging in the cellars. Departure to the charming town of Amarante, stands on both sides of the Tâmega River.

Overnight in Amares.

### DAY 6. AMARES | BRAGA | VIANA DO CASTELO | PONTE DE LIMA | AMARES

Breakfast at the hotel. Direction Braga, one of the oldest Christian cities in the world with a vast religious heritage, as the sanctuaries that make up the triangle of faith: the Cathedral and the Sanctuaries of Bom Jesus and Sameiro. Continue to Viana do Castelo, a seaside town at the mouth of the Lima River, famous for its craftsmanship and the colors of its traditional costumes. Above, overlooking the city, stands the shrine of Santa Luzia. Before heading back to the hotel, drive to Ponte de Lima, sitting in the region, where is produced the famous vinho verde (green wine).

Overnight in Amares.

### DAY 7, AMARES I GUIMARÃES I PORTO

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Set off to Guimarães, considered as the cradle of Portugal, because it was born Alphonse Henriques who will become the first king of this



Associated with the formation and the identity of Portugal, the historical center of Guimarães located within the enclosure of the walls was classified world inheritance by UNESCO. Departure to Porto, capital and gateway to the northern region, Porto is an ancient city that gave its name to Portugal and wine known around the world: the port wine. With a magnificent location near the mouth of the Douro River and an architectonic ensemble of exceptional value, the historic center of Porto has been a World Heritage Site since 1996.



### DAY 3. PORTO | DOURO VALLEY

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Set to the phenomenal Douro region, the first demarcated wine region of the World (1756) and where the famous Port Wine is produced. You'll be able to learn more about the production of the wines, while enjoying the beautiful landscape, World Heritage by UNESCO since 2001. The tour through the Douro Valley is ideal for getting to know the culture of wine in the region of the Douro Valley, the culture of the people and the great natural beauty of the River and the Valley of the Douro River, without doubt one of the most beautiful in Europe. Lunch in a local vineyard, with visit and wine tasting. Overnight in Douro Valley.

### DAY 4. DOURO VALLEY | SANGALHOS | BUÇACO | COIMBRA

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Head to the Bairrada region, with abundant rainfall and mild temperatures that helps to produce grapes with high acidity and low alcohol content, ideal for making sparkling wines. Visit to a wine cellar and wine tasting. Then proceed to the large and majestic forest of Serra do Buçaco, a genuine botanical garden with 700 species, protected by a Papal Bull issued in the 17th century. Departure to Coimbra.

### DAY 1. PORTO

Arrival at Porto airport and pick-up of the rental car. Overnight in Porto.

### DAY 2. PORTO

Breakfast at the hotel. The city of PORTO is rich in well-preserved treasures, including Gothic, Baroque and Neoclassical monuments, as the Cathedral, the Tower of Clérigos and the area of Ribeira (UNESCO world heritage site). ### DAY 5. COIMBRA | ÓBIDOS | LISBON

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Coimbra, the city of students, so called to host one of the first universities in Europe and the most important of the country. Stroll in the oldest part of Coimbra, made of narrow streets that lead to the top of the hill. Departure to the charming village of Óbidos. Travel back in time in this walled medieval town and admire its Gothic churches and the narrow winding streets in stone. Proceed to Lisbon.

Overnight in Lisbon.

### DAY 6. LISBON | SINTRA | LISBON

Breakfast at the hotel. In a city that has been influenced by many different far-off cultures over time, there is still a village feel in each historic neighborhood. Stroll through the Pombaline grid of streets in the Baixa district that opens on to the Tagus in Praça do Comércio, then follow the river to discover some of the city's most beautiful parts: the monumental area of Belém with its World Heritage monuments, the mediaeval district of Alfama and the latest contemporary leisure spaces, such as the Parque das Nações. Departure to Sintra, a beautiful village declared world heritage by UNESCO. In the evening, dinner at a traditional restaurant while enjoying a Fado show. Return to the hotel.

Overnight in Lisbon.

### DAY 7. LISBON | ÉVORA | LISBON

Breakfast at the hotel. Set off to Évora, standing in the middle of the beautiful plains of the Alentejo. This walled city was declared World Heritage by UNESCO. We will visit the Roman Temple, dating back to the 3rd century AD and recovered in the 19th century and the strange Chapel of Bones with its pillars and walls covered by bones, from the 17th century. Visit to a winery with wine, cheese and olive tasting. Return to Lisbon.

Overnight in Lisbon.



Heading north to Arraiolos, a

small very typical town in Alentejo and well known for its famous tapestries. Departure to Estremoz, nicknamed "the white city" due to its block of houses of this color, but also to be one of the largest exporters of white marble in the world. Finish the day at the medieval and walled village of Marvão.

Overnight in Marvão.

### DAY 4. MARVÃO | CASTELO DE VIDE | CASTELO BRANCO | LINHARES DA BEIRA | VISEU

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Departure to Castelo de Vide, a typical village of Alentejo, with small white houses, winding streets and flowers. Head towards the region of Beira Baixa, on Castelo Branco, where you can see the Episcopal Palace Garden, emblem of the city and example of Portuguese Baroque. Then continue to one of the historic villages of Portugal: Linhares da Beira. Medieval village of the 12th century, it possesses a unique architectural diversity, inherited from different eras, and also known as the paragliding capital of Portugal. Finally, in the center of the country, standing on a plateau surrounded by chains of mountains and rivers, the city of Viseu, crowned by its imposing cathedral.

Overnight in Viseu.

### DAY 5. VISEU | VILA REAL | AMARANTE | GUIMARÃES

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Departure in the region of the Douro Valley, the first wine region in the world to be demarcated, having its landscape classified as World Heritage of UNESCO. In Vila Real you can visit one of the most beautiful Baroque palaces in Portugal, the House of Mateus, and its gardens. The charming town of Amarante stands on either side of the Tâmega River. The bridge of Amarante perpetuates the memory of the heroic resistance of the population against the Napoleonic forces who, at the beginning of the nineteenth century invaded Portugal.



Continuation to Guimarães, considered as the cradle of Portugal, because it was born Alphonse Henriques who will become the first king of this country. Associated with the formation and identity of Portugal, the historic center of Guimarães within the walls has been declared World Heritage by Unesco, on the basis of originality and authenticity, guided its renovation.

Overnight in Guimarães.

### DAY 6. GUIMARÃES | BRAGA | PONTE DE LIMA | GUIMARÃES

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Direction Braga, one of the oldest Christian cities in the world with a vast religious heritage, as are the sanctuaries that make up the triangle of faith: the Cathedral and Sanctuaries of Bom Jesus and Sameiro. Continue to Ponte de Lima. The Roman bridge that crosses the Lima River at this point has given rise to the name of this ancient city, rich agricultural region, where is produced the famous green wine (vinho verde). Return to the hotel. Overnight in Guimarães.

### DAY 7, GUIMARÃES | PORTO | AVEIRO

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Departure to Porto, capital and gateway to the northern region, Porto is an ancient city that gave its name to Portugal and wine known around the world: the port wine. With a magnificent location near the mouth of the Douro and an architectonic complex of exceptional value, the historic center of Porto is Heritage of Humanity since 1996. Continue to Aveiro, the "Portuguese Venice", crossed by the Ria de Aveiro, lagoon basin where the fresh waters of the Vouga river mix with the waters of the sea, navigable by the moliceiros, small colored boats.

Overnight in Aveiro

### DAY 8. AVEIRO | COIMBRA | TOMAR | ÓBIDOS

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Departure to Coimbra, the city of students, so called to host one of the first universities in Europe and the largest in the country. Stroll through the oldest part of Coimbra, made of narrow and steep streets that lead to the top of the col-line. ### DAY 9. ÓBIDOS | MAFRA | CABO DA ROCA | CASCAIS | **ESTORIL | LISBON**

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Departure to Mafra, known for its imposing palace palace, the largest Portuguese building, built in the eighteenth century. Cross the Sintra--Cascais Natural Park to arrive at the most westerly point of continental Europe, Cabo da Roca. On the way to Cascais by the coast, enjoy the seascape. In Estoril, we highlight the gardens of the biggest Casino in Europe.

Overnight in Lisbon.





Continuation to Évora, classified World Heritage of UNESCO since 1986 is the capital of the region of Alentejo. Due to its historical richness and the impressive number of monuments of different styles and eras, it has been dubbed City-Museum. To have:

Roman Temple, one of the symbols of the Roman presence in Portugal and one of the most important monuments of the city

Cathedral, the largest in Portugal, dedicated to Our Lady of the Assumption and completed in 1250. Romano-Gothic. (Entrance included)

Giraldo Square, lively center of Évora, square lined with Gothic arches. Church of St. Francis, Gothic, she was part of an old Franciscan monastery.

Chapel of the Bones, walls entirely covered with skulls and bones of more than 5,000 people (entry included).

Visit of a production of cork.

Departure towards Vila Viçosa for dinner and accommodation in a Pousada.

### DAY 4. VILA VIÇOSA | REDONDO | ALANDROAL | BORBA | VILA VIÇOSA

Breakfast and departure for the discovery of Vila Viçosa, nicknamed "The Princess of Alentejo", capital of Portuguese marble.

Visit the city and its Ducal Palace, former residence of the Dukes of Braganza. Facade 110 meters long, completely covered with marble of the region, this unique example of Portuguese civil architecture is the most emblematic building of the city. Road to Re-dondo, walk in the city and continue to Alandroal for lunch.

In the afternoon continue to Borba, center of a region where one produces one of the most famous wines of Alentejo. Visit and tasting in a Cooperative Winery Wine Cellar. If time permits, visit a marble exploration.

Return to the hotel for dinner and accommodation.



### DAY 5. VILA VIÇOSA | MONSARAZ | AMIEIRA | BEJA | ALGARVE

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure towards Monsaraz, city surrounded by ramparts that has maintained its medieval character. Streets in schist and pretty warm-bleached houses. Beautiful panorama of Lake Alqueva (the largest artificial lake in Europe)

Continuation to Beja, capital of the region of Lower Alentejo, known by its former convent of Our Lady of Conception where lived Mariana Alcoforado, nun who wrote the "Lettres Portugaises" to Noel Chamilly, Count of Saint -Light when he returned to France, after his campaign as a soldier in Alentejo. Arrive in Algarve at the end of the day for dinner and overnight at the hotel.

### DAY 6. PORTIMÃO | LAGOS | SAGRES

Full day discovery of the western Algarve region: Portimão located on the bank of the Arade with its narrow streets where you can enjoy typical houses with facades and friezes of azulejos, iron balconies and faience balustrades. I Lagos where Henry the Navigator had built the first ships for his maritime expeditions. Lagos was the city where the caravels loaded with gold, ivory and slaves arrived. In 1578, starting point of the Portuguese fleet, commanded by Dom Sebastião, for the conquest of Alcazarquibir, it became a famous seaside resort. Sagres promontory known for its fortress (overview). Dinner and accommodation in the Algarve.

### DAY 7. CRUZEIRO NO RIO GUADIANA

Morning departure to Vila Real de Santo Antonio, Cruise on the Guadiana River, natural border between Spain and Portugal.

Stop at the village of Foz de Odeleite.





Return to Funchal.

Overnight in Funchal.

### DAY 3. FUNCHAL | CALHETA | SÃO VICENTE | FUNCHAL

Breakfast at the hotel. Take the direction of the sunny coasts of Ponta do Sol and Calheta, very rich in bathing areas that invite you to swim. You can also visit the Casa das Mudas Arts Center, which offers an extensive cultural program through-out the year.

The beaches of the picturesque villages of Jardim and Paul do Mar offer sports lovers excellent surfing. Then take the direction of Porto Moniz and regain strength, during an invigorating bath in the famous natural swimming pools dug into the rock. The journey continues in the direction of São Vicente, on a road dotted with waterfalls and where the contrast between the majestic green and the crystalline blue of the waters of the sea is obvious. Here you can visit the caves and the center of Volcanism, the exhibition center - Lime Road or simply walk through the narrow streets of this charming little town. Return to Funchal.

Overnight in Funchal.

### DAY 4. FUNCHAL | SANTANA | FUNCHAL

Breakfast at the hotel. Head towards the town of Santana, declared Reserve of the Biosphere in 2011 by UNESCO. This reserve incorporates a terrestrial element, corresponding to the whole surface of the municipality, but also a marine element, which presents a great diversity of natural, human, landscape, environmental and cultural values of local, regional, national and international interest. The municipality was for a very long time inaccessible by sea and by land, its inhabitants have preserved characteristics that have not undergone external influences. One of the examples of this isolation is the architectonic style of its typical houses with thatched roof more commonly known as "Santana's small houses". Return to Funchal. Overnight in Funchal.

### DAY 5. FUNCHAL

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Rental car drop off at Funchal airport.

# DAY 2. FURNAS | LAGOA DAS SETE CIDADES | PONTA DELGADA |

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure to the western part of the island, where the mountains and the Lagoa das Sete Cidades (Lake of the Seven Cities) are located. From Vista do Rei look-out you will enjoy a panoramic view of the lake, asleep inside a huge volcanic crater. Descent to the village of Sete Cidades, a faithful image of the rural life of the Azores. Overlooking a natural bay, the city of Ponta Delgada has a rich history and architectural heritage. The Portas da Cidade (City Gates) are the perfect starting point for exploring the city. They are quickly identified by their three arches that link the sea front area and the Praça da República. Note the typical architecture that emphasizes the contrast between the white walls and the details in basalt, embellished with lacy iron balconies. While in S $\mbox{\sc ao}$ Miguel island, we suggest you enjoy a whale watching experience. Overnight in Furnas.

### DAY 3. FURNAS | LAGOA DO FOGO | LAGOA DAS FURNAS | FURNAS

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure to Lagoa do Fogo. On the way, we will be able to appreciate the beauty of the lagoon, with its crystalline waters that reflect the surrounding landscape. We continue the visit, but this time on the north coast to Ribeira Grande where the baroque architecture of the 17th and 18th centuries characterizes this city. From the viewpoint of Pico do Ferro we will see the breath-taking landscapes of the oldest and

largest volcanic crater on the island, in which lies the Lagoa das Furnas. Overnight in Furnas.

### DAY 4. FURNAS | PONTA DELGADA | ANGRA DO HEROÍSMO

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Delivery of the rental car at Ponta Delgada airport. Embark on the flight to Angra do Heroísmo (not included). Arrival at Terceira airport and pick-up of the rental car. Overnight in Angra do Heroísmo.

### DAY 5. ANGRA DO HEROÍSMO | PRAIA DA VITÓRIA | BISCOITOS | ANGRA DO HEROÍSMO

Breakfast at the hotel. What makes the island of Terceira so special is the magnificent contrast between the natural beauty of this volcanic island and the admirable work that man has done in the historical center of Angra do Heroísmo, his capital city founded in 1534, the first town in the Azores to enjoy the status of city and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Angra is an ideal starting point for exploring the coastal area of the island. Take a drive to Praia da Vitória, with the Ilhéus das Cabras (islets) in the background, through the bay of Salga and the black sand beaches surrounded by cliffs such as Porto Novo. Continue to Biscoitos, home of the famous Verdelho wine, where you can visit the Wine Museum and the seaside area with natural pools, such as Ponta do Queimado.

Overnight in Angra do Heroísmo.

### DAY 6. ANGRA DO HEROÍSMO | PONTA DELGADA

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Delivery of the rental car at Terceira airport. END OF OUR SERVICES







# DAY 1. PONTA DELGADA

Arrival at the airport of Ponta Delgada and transfer to the hotel located in the capital of the Island.

Ponta Delgada is a modern city that preserves its original character with its narrow streets full of traditional trade, markets and delicacy shops. Dinner and overnight stay at the hotel.

### DAY 2. PONTA DELGADA | VILA FRANCA DO CAMPO

Breakfast and departure to visit the heart of Ponta Delgada, from the Square of Gonçalo Velho Cabral, to the Graça market, the Fort of São Brás, to the Church of Senhor Santo Cristo/ Church of Nossa Senhora da Esperança, stopping at the Campo of São Francisco, where the second most important religious event of the country is held, and the Church of the Jesuit College of Ponta Delgada. Free Lunch in Ponta Delgada.-Following lunch, we go to Vila Franca do Campo - the first capital of the island, where the Islet of Vila Franca is located which was made a natu-ral reserve in 1983 and which can only be visited between June and September. We should not leave without tasting the traditional queijadas of Vila Franca do Campo, we are able to visit the factory where we can learn the method of preparation of these traditional island cake and of course to taste it! Our day ends at the Sanctuary of Nossa Senhora da Paz, a small shrine with a staircase of 100 steps. The current temple dates back to the 18th century and has been built on a previous one probably dating from the 16th century, it was built by the population to honour the Virgin, be-cause on that location a shepherd, miraculously found, a picture of her.

Return to the hotel at the end of the day for dinner and overnight stay.

# DAY 3. RIBEIRA GRANDE | LAGOA DO FOGO | CALDEIRA VELHA

Breakfast and departure to discover one of the 7 Wonders of Portugal, the Lagoa do Fogo (visit subject to weather conditions). In the view-point we will have the opportunity to observe the magnificent view. We descend toward the Caldeira Velha which is formed by waterfalls, pools of thermal waters with an average temperature of 34 degrees, where it is possible to bath. Free lunch. In the afternoon we will have a small tour in the city of Ribeira Grande, of baroque architecture, where we can find the building in which the Theater is located that has been functioning since 1922, the Manueline window and the Nossa Senhora da Estrela Church. Before returning to the hotel we will have time to toast our first day of discovery. We will visit the Mulher of the Capote factory where we will taste some regional liquors. Return to the hotel at the end of the day for dinner and overnight stay.



### **DAY 4. FURNAS**

Breakfast at the hotel and departure towards the Furnas Valley (one of the main reasons for visiting the Azores) which is part of one of the three central active volcanoes of São Miguel Island. Here the smell of sulfur and the bubbling fumaroles, are characteristic. A stop at Lagoa das Furnas, where the famous Furnas Stew is cooked inside the earth, which we will have the opportunity to taste at lunch in one of the local restaurants. In the west bank of the Lagoa das Furnas we will find the Nossa Senhora das Vitórias Chapel, an impressive example of the neo-gothic style, unique in the archipelago. During the afternoon, a visit to the calderas and the village, our next stop is at the Terra Nostra Park, a bicentennial garden, with unique spe-cies and a superb thermal pool (possibility of bathing). The park is a unique repository of tree, plants and other plant species from all over the world. Return to the hotel at the end of the day for dinner and overnight stay.

### **DAY 5. SETE CIDADES**

Breakfast and departure from the Hotel towards Sete Cidades. We are setting off on an adventure and discover the Wetland Lakes, then the Lagoa of Canário, visit the viewpoint of grota do inferno, stop at the viewing point of King´s View and then to the Cumeeiras of Sete Cidades, Here, we descend to the village where we shall have lunch at the Lagoa Azul restaurant. Here, the Pineapple is produced in glass greenhouses, with the use of traditional cultivation techniques such as applying "smoke" and using the "hot bed", based on plant matter.

Then, continue to the tea plantations, to visit the oldest tea plantation in Europe since 1883. The art of cultivating tea was introduced in the Azores by two Chinese experts in September 1874. A visit of the factory to get to know the production process, tea tasting. Return to Ponta Delgada. Free afternoon to enjoy the city.



Then we will visit the Igreja do Colégio, where we can find the Centre of Sacred Art of the Carlos Machado Museum, before passing through the Antero de Quental Garden, named in honor of the Azorean writer. It is time to rest and return to the hotel.

#### DAY 2, SÃO MIGUEL

Breakfast at the hotel and departure to Furnas through the south coast, with a stop in Caloura, a bathing area, which delights those who go there for the baths, by the fisheries harbour, whose name originates from the fact that it feels very hot around there! After which we pass by the Agua

One of the most visited sites on the island nowadays. Departure to Sete Cidades, with a stop at the Grota do Inferno viewpoint, which has one of the most beautiful landscapes of the island due to being at 1000m of altitude. Stop at the Vista do Rei viewpoint, known due to the fact that on the 6th July 1901, the King D. Carlos and Queen D. Amelia were there, a visit to the Lagoa das Sete Cidades, one of the 7 Wonders of Portugal a place of excellence for lovers of sport in nature, and then to the village of Mosteiros, a picturesque parish where the sunset is unmatched. Finally visit the Thermal baths of Ferraria, a thermal complex, where there are many outdoor activities, Spa or thermal baths. Return to the hotel

#### DAY 4. FAIAL ISLAND

Transfer to the airport and flight to the island of Faial. Transfer to the Hotel and then a walking tour through the city of Horta with stops at the following locations, Monte da Guia, classified as a Special Protection Area, which has a magnificent view over Horta. #### **DAY 5. FAIAL ISLAND**



Visit the Seminar church of Santarem an important Jesuit temple from the 17th century. Departure to FATIMA, a pilgrimage centre, religiously called the \"Altar of the World\". Visit the most important monuments: Chapel of the Apparitions and Sanctuary. It was the first building constructed in COVA DE IRIA, the place of the Apparitions of Our Lady Dinner and accommodation at the hotel.

#### DAY 1. LISBON

Arrival at Lisbon airport. Pick-up by an Osiris representative at the airport and private transfer to the Hotel. Lisbon is a brightly lit city and the sun is a constant presence which together with the River Tagus transform this Portuguese city into a mirror of colours-highlighting the architecture and unique beauty of the city. There are so many things to see and do in Lisbon that visitors always have a wide range of choices to make and experiences to enjoy. #### DAY 4. FÁTIMA | COIMBRA | PORTO

Breakfast. Departure to COIMBRA, visit the famous University, one of the oldest in the world, the New Cathedral (an important Jesuit Church (17th century) and the OCUMN (University Centre Manuel da Nóbrega), it was the first Jesuit university in Portugal. Since 1975, it offers its services to the University of Coimbra. There is time to also visit the seminar which is very important to new Jesuits. Departure to PORTO the second largest city in Portugal, Visit a Port wine cellar and wine tasting. Arrival, dinner and accommodation at the Hotel.

#### DAY 5. PORTO | BRAGA

After breakfast visit PORTO, whose name originated the name of the country. PORTO is an ancient city that remains true to its charisma and is well known through the world famous Port wine. Stroll through Praça da Liberdade with the statue of king Pedro IV of Portugal (Pedro I of Brazil), the Clérigos Church a curious tower that was used to guide fishermen back home, the Palacio da Bolsa (neoclassical 19th century), the Ribeira (old town), the Castelo do Queijo (Cheese castle). We must not forget the Church and College of São Lourenço, popularly known as the Church of the crickets, built by Jesuits in 1577 in a Baroque Jesuit mannerist style. Departure to BRAGA, capital of the Minho region. Dinner and accommodation at the hotel.

#### DAY 6. BRAGA | GUIMARÃES | BRAGA

Breakfast. Visit of the city of BRAGA: the cathedral, the Church of St. Paul built by the Jesuits in 1589 and the Sanctuary of Sameiro [year 1863] and Bom Jesus (14th century) the possibility of arranging a meeting with the Jesuit community of Braga. In the afternoon, visit the city of GUIMARAES - the cradle of the Portuguese nation, stroll through the city. Dinner and accommodation at the hotel.


#### DAY 7. BRAGA | LAGUARDIA | STA. MARIA DE OIA | ST.COMPOSTELA

Breakfast. Departure for SPAIN the first stop being at LA GUARDIA, where we find the Apostolic school of S. Martin. Continuing northwards, stop at SANTA MARIA OF OIA to enjoy the medieval monastery. Continue to SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA, world-famous for its baroque cathedral [1075]. We can also visit the tomb of St. James, one of the apostles of Jesus Christ, the historic tourist and religious centre, pay special attention to the Cathedral and the Square of Obradório, where countless pilgrims arrive daily from the famous Camino de Santiago. Arrival, dinner and accommodation at the Hotel...









#### DAY 8. SANTIAGO DE COMPOSTELA | OVIEDO

Breakfast. Travel to OVIEDO, the economic and cultural capital of Asturias, arrival and free time to discover the city. Check-in, dinner and accommodation at Hotel in OVIEDO.

#### DAY 9. OVIEDO | AZPEITIA | SAN SEBASTIAN

Breakfast. Visit the sanctuary of Loyola built on the birthplace of St Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the Jesuit Order. Free time in the Sanctuary. Dinner and accommodation at the Hotel IN San Sebastian.

#### DAY 10. SAN SEBASTIAN | JAVIER

After breakfast, departure to the birthplace of St Francis Xavier - JAVIER, a Christian missionary and apostle of Portuguese Navarro patronage. A pioneer and co-founder of the Jesuits, the Roman Catholic Church believes that he converted more people to Christianity than any other missionary in São Paulo, earning the title \"Apostle of the East\". Continue to LEIRE, to visit the" Monastery of San Salvador of Leire\". Departure for SANGÜESA (5 Km of Javier) to visit the church of \"Santa Maria la Real\", built on the site of a roman temple. Continue to SAN SEBASTIAN, Donastia in Basque, known as the Pearl of the Cantabria, panoramic tour. Check-in, dinner and accommodation in Hotel at SAN SEBASTIAN.


#### DAY 11. SAN SEBASTIAN | LOURDES

Breakfast, and departure to Lourdes, where the most visited Marian shrine in Europe is located. Dinner and accommodation.

#### DAY 12, LOURDES

Breakfast. In the morning city visit and the opportunity to learn aspects of the Apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary in 1858 to the Saint Bernadette Soubirous. Above the grotto of the apparitions of the Virgin three superimposed churches were built: the Crypt, the Basilica of the Rosary and the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception, providing an impressive vision. Full day to visit the basilicas, Grotto of the Apparitions and participate in liturgies, candle lit procession. Dinner and accommodation.





#### JEWISH HERITAGE TOUR PORTUGAL & SPAIN (15 NIGHTS) (GROUP)

#### DAY 1. LISBON

Arrival in Lisbon and private transfer to the hotel. Overnight in Lisbon.

#### DAY 2. LISBON

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure for a full day tour of Lisbon, finding all about the Jewish legacy in the Portuguese capital. It is known that until 1496 there were three Jewish Quarters in Lisbon. Besides strolling through Alfama, we will visit the church of São Domingos, in Rossio, in Largo de S. Domingos, where the Jewish Massacre of Lisbon took place in 1506. In the afternoon, we leave towards the district of Belém, where were built the monuments alluding to the time of the Maritime Discoveries in the 15th and 16th centuries. Free time to lunch. We will stop at the Belém Tower (classified as World Heritage by UNESCO), the 15th century fortress and departure point of caravels, and at the Discoveries Monument to mark the 500th anniversary of the death of Henry the Navigator. We will then visit the Monastery of Jeronimos (classified as World Heritage by UNESCO), a masterpiece of Manueline architecture. Return to the hotel. Overnight in Lisbon.

#### DAY 3. LISBON | TOMAR | PORTO

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. We set off to Tomar to visit the Synagogue and Luso-Hebrew Museum of Abraham Zacuto. A very rare example of a medieval Jewish temple and of pre-Renaissance Portuguese art, the Tomar Synagogue is the only one of its kind from this period to have been fully preserved in Portugal. Before leaving, it is mandatory to visit the Templar Castle and the Convent of Christ in Tomar, a unique monument in the history of the western world, awarded the classification of world heritage by UNESCO. Built on a site that was originally used for Roman worship, this vast monumental complex illustrates seven centuries of Portugal's history and contains several important mementoes of decisive moments in the history of the western world. Free time to lunch. Departure to Porto at the hotel. Overnight in Porto.







#### DAY 5. PORTO | TRANCOSO | BELMONTE | CASTELO BRANCO

Douro before heading back to the hotel. Overnight in Porto.

1937. In the afternoon, you will take a 50-minutes cruise through the

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Departure from Porto towards the medieval town of Trancoso, strongly marked by an ancestral Jewish presence. The town's historic center, surrounded by walls, allows us to discover the façades of old houses, where regular granite stones follow the sinuous outline of the streets, kept since the middle ages. We will visit to the Isaac Cardoso Jewish Culture Interpretation Centre. Founded in 2012, the goal of this space, where the modern Beit Mayim (the Well of Living Water) synagogue stands out, is to be a place for culture and debate by teaching about the ancient legacy Beira Jewish communities have left behind. We leave to Belmonte, which is, perhaps, the Portuguese town with the strongest Jewish presence and it stands out because it was a unique case, within the Iberian Peninsula, where Hebrew culture and tradition have lasted since the early 16th century until today. We will visit the Jewish Museum, the first museum that portrays the History of Jewish people in Portugal, as well as its integration in the society and the decisive role it played in Portuguese culture, art, literature and trade. We will end the day in Castelo Branco, city that became a refuge to a large community of New Christians when the Jews were expelled or forced to convert by the Inquisition. Check-in at the hotel. Overnight in Castelo Branco.

#### DAY 6. CASTELO BRANCO | MADRID

Breakfast at the hotel and check-out. Departure to Madrid. Sightseeing tour of Madrid. Check-in at the hotel. Overnight in Madrid.

#### DAY 7. MADRID | TOLEDO | MADRID

After Breakfast. This day is devoted to Toledo, perched high on a hill by the Tagus River. With its naturally fortified location, Toledo was once the true center of Spain, and is widely considered a "pearl" in terms of its subtle beauty. This city was also the center for Jewish Spain, with a rich, creative heritage. You will feel this atmosphere as you stroll the narrow alleys in its historic section. Your tour will include El Greco's house, formerly the palace of the prominent Samuel Halevy (treasurer of King Pedro I, and architect of the El Transito Synagogue). Continue to Sinagoga de Santa Maria La Blanca, later converted to a church, and to the Sinagoga del Transito, which today houses the Sephardic Museum. Return to Madrid in the afternoon and enjoy time at leisure. Overnight in Madrid.

#### DAY 8. MADRID | AVILA | SEGOVIA | MADRID

After breakfast, take a full day excursion to Avila and Segovia. Tour of Avila to include the imposing city walls and the former Jewish areas (Juderias). In Segovia, you will sense history as you tour the historic part of the town including the Aqueduct, and the Jewish Quarter. Though only few traces tells the story of a glorious past, Segovia stills stands as a remarkable monument to its past. Return to Madrid in the afternoon. Overnight in Madrid.

#### DAY 9. MADRID | CÓRDOBA

After breakfast. This morning, check out from the hotel and transfer by coach to Cordoba, the former home of many Jewish scholars and poets. Once the biggest city in all of Europe, Cordoba thrived and expanded with its unique blend of cultures. These are beautifully expressed with a visit to Mezquita, the most significant Muslim architectural achievement in the Western world. Walk the street leading up to the Juderia, with its whitewashed houses and colorful courtyards and shops. Though not Jewish in its current expression, a few signs hint of the Golden Age. Note, for example, the tiny, gem-like Synagogue, as well as the statue of the great court doctor and Torah sage, Maimonides (Rabbi Moshe Ben Maimon). Overnight in Cordoba.

#### DAY 10. CÓRDOBA | SEVILHA | CÓRDOBA

After breakfast, a short drive will take you to Seville. Upon arrival begin a tour of this classic city. The tour will include the imposing Cathedral, said to be one of the largest in the world. Here, find the resting place of Spanish Kings and Queens, as well as the impressive sepulcher of Christopher Columbus – but are his remains there? Continue past the Alcazar Palace, still used as a residence for the Spanish Royal Family, to the grand Plaza Espana, site of the pavilion of the great 1992 exhibition. Finally, visit the Barrio de Santa Cruz – the former Jewish Quarter. Today, it is one of Seville's most charming areas. Return to Cordoba in the afternoon. Overnight in Cordoba.

#### DAY 11. CORDOBA | BAENA | LUCENA | CÓRDOBA

After breakfast, enjoy a day to rest and explore Cordoba on your own or join a tour into the Andalusian countryside. In Baena, visit the Olive Oil museum and pay respect to Jose Luis Santaelle, recognized as Righteous among the Nations for helping the Jewish people in Berlin. Later visit Lucena, formerly known as the Pearl of Sefarad. Enjoy a walking tour of the picturesque town. Later return to Cordoba in the late afternoon. Overnight in Cordoba.

#### DAY 12. CÓRDOBA | GRANADA | BARCELONA

Breakfast. This morning, leave for Granada. Upon arrival, visit one of the Wonders of the World, the Moorish Palace of Alhambra and the Generalife. Located on a hilltop with the Sierra Nevada as background, Alhambra's exquisite design and layout have few rivals. Be filled with a sense of mystique as you are guided past graceful courtyards, splashing fountains and lavish rooms. In the afternoon, check in for the flight to Barcelona. Transfer to the hotel in Barcelona. Overnight in Barcelona.


#### DAY 13, BARCELONA

After breakfast sightseeing in the most exciting city Spain can offer – Barcelona, capital of the Catalonian province. Begin with a visit to one of Spain's landmarks: the incomplete architectural masterpiece of Antonio Gaudi, known as the Sagrada Familia (Sacred Family). Next, continue on a walking tour through the centuries-old streets and alleys of the Gothic Quarter of Barcelona. You tour will include an introduction to this former Jewish area in Barcelona. Visit the oldest Synagogue in Barcelona, which has recently been restored. Remainder of the day at leisure. Overnight in Barcelona.

#### DAY 14. BARCELONA | GIRONA | BESALU | BARCELONA

Breakfast. Today, drive northward to visit Girona, which stands today not only as a charming example of Spain's quaint early-Medieval ambience, but also as a reminder of the days when Jewish traditions bloomed. Girona was once a link between the first Kabbalists of Provence and the poets and writers of Cordoba and Toledo — also major Kabbalah Centers. Jewish settlers came to Girona at the end of the 9th century, growing and prospering until the Spanish Inquisition forced them into exile in 1492 – a span of 600 years! Walking through the "Call" (Jewish Quarter) still evokes this precious Jewish culture, an important part of the Golden Age of Spain. The spirit of our ancestors, you will sense, has never vanished. Visit the Archeological and Jewish Museums during your tour. Lunch. Later, continue to Besalu, to see the remains of the pre-Inquisition Mikveh. Return to Barcelona in the afternoon. Overnight in Barcelona.
